**on the topic: UX and Human-Centered AI – Ethics, Privacy and Transparency**

You are cordially invited to participate in a *HCII Design Café* introduced for the first time in the context of the [24<sup>th</sup> International Conference on Human-Computer Interaction](#) an international forum for the dissemination, exchange, and discussion of state-of-the-art scientific information on theoretical and applied areas of Human-Computer-Interaction, offering 21 Thematic Areas / Affiliated Conferences held under one management and one registration.

### The HCII 2022 Design Café

A new, innovative, interdisciplinary, interactive and participatory event is added to the HCII conference. Inspired by the World Café method, the *HCII Design Café* provides space for discussion and rethinking of important topics of global interest. Participation in the HCII2022 Design Café requires separate registration with a nominal fee (\$50 for registered Conference participants, and \$120 for non-registered individuals). The event will be of interest to academic and research staff, students from universities and design schools, professionals working in design or R&D departments in industry, government institutions, service providers, decision-makers, etc. As the number of places is limited, applications will be treated on a first-come, first-served basis.

### Topic of the HCII2022 Design Café: UX and Human-Centered AI (HCAI) – Ethics, Privacy and Transparency

The objective of the *HCII2022 Design Café* is to start a critical discussion on some core issues of AI that are of interest to the HCI community, namely HCAI and UX design of AI-enabled systems, explainability, transparency, ethical design of Autonomous and Intelligent Systems (AIS) and privacy. Interaction and discussion will be moderated in a face-to-face group setup with the goal to find innovative approaches that can be transferred into practice. The results and findings of the *HCII2022 Design Café* will be published.

The topics of the HCII2022 Design Café are informed by the findings of the open access [IJHCI article](#) “Seven HCI Grand Challenges”, arising in the emerging landscape of rapid technological evolution towards more intelligent interactive technologies, coupled with the increasing societal needs and the broad spectrum of expectations that HCI, as a discipline, is called upon to address.
